Over-punching may seem a simple matter, and it is, but the wealth of detail hidden behind that simplicity could baffle the average collector.

Turner has made a specialized area, clear and easily understandable to the casual collector. Not only that, but the lavish use of large colour illustrations makes attribution easy.

Turner also subjects his observations to detailed scientific scrutiny.

The nature of a random sampling, and phrases such as 'confidence intervals' are not normally part of numismatic publishing.

Collectors, whose math isn't up to such analysis can read the book without having to struggle through the mathematical proof.

Those who understand those things can go through the details in the first two appendixes.

VOLUME TWO RELEASED

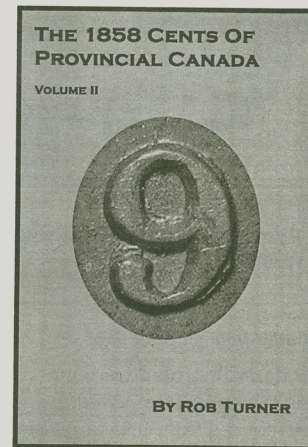
Anyone familiar with Rob Turner's first book, *The 1858 cents of Provincial Canada*, will be excited to know that the second volume is now available.

This book picks up where the last one left off, and presents the result of years of research on 1859 cents, struck using 1858 dies.

Back then, dies were quite expensive, and over-punching the last digit of a good die to get more use out of it was very common.

The book also includes more on some 1858 cent discoveries made since the first volume was published.
